1. Blessing the Community

(a) Ceramic Workshop for Seniors

In partnership with Fei Yue Community Services, our Primary 5 student leaders had the opportunity to conduct a ceramics workshop for seniors as part of an Intergenerational Learning Programme. Before meeting the seniors, our student leaders had to be equipped with the right communication techniques and learn how to make their own ceramic pieces.

On Thursday, 4 April 2024, our student leaders warmly welcomed the seniors to the ceramics workshop at our very own Art Room. They facilitated the session and taught the seniors how to mould the clay and create their own unique ceramic pieces to bring home. Through facilitating the workshop and interacting with the seniors, our student leaders had much to glean from the experience. They were able to dispel the myths and stereotypes about ageing and developed greater awareness of the challenges faced by seniors in our community.

(b) Whampoa Give and Take Market

The Whampoa Give and Take Market is a local initiative to complement national efforts to support families in need. Before the event, our student leaders started a donation drive with our ACS(J) students. They received a variety of books and stationery from them which would be used to support lower-income families in the Whampoa and Bendemeer areas. Our students helped to pack and differentiate the books based on their language and reading levels. On Sunday, 5 May 2024, our student leaders manned a booth at Whampoa Community Club, interacted with different families and distributed sets of books and stationery to them. Through this initiative, our students learnt about volunteerism, care for society and how they could impact a community through the power of collaboration.

2. Learning Journeys

In Term 2, our Primary 1 boys embarked on a walking adventure around our neighbourhood in Newton, practising road safety rules and exploring places such as the Cairnhill Community Club and our former campus at Peck Hay Road. As part of museum-based learning, our Primary 4 boys visited Geylang Serai Heritage Gallery and Kreta Ayer Heritage Gallery to learn about the contributions of the Malay and Chinese communities in Singapore respectively. These experiences not only enriched our boys' understanding of the world beyond their classrooms, but also nurtured bonds of camaraderie.

3. ACS(J) English Week

The ACS(J) English Week was organised from Monday, 22 April to Friday, 26 April 2024 to grow the joy of learning English in our boys. Themed "Around the World in 5 Days", our boys learnt to appreciate literature during their lessons and fun activities during recess. We would like to thank all parent volunteers for their support in the recess activities.

4. ACS(J) Book Character Day

The ACS(J) Book Character Day took place on Friday, 26 April 2024. Held in conjunction with the ACS(J) English Week, our boys and teachers alike dressed up as their favourite book characters to commemorate the occasion.
